


SURVIVAL GUIDE





Introduction

We are very pleased to welcome you to the 25th Annual Conference of the Australian and New Zealand Studies Association of North America, which will take place in Guadalajara, Mexico. Guadalajara is known for its tequila and mariachi. It is a very welcoming and interesting city with many possible activities and places to explore. This guide contains information to help you to familiarise with the city and enjoy your time as much as possible.



Arrival

Border Control

Passport holders who do not require a visa (to check if you need one click here) may use a visitor's permit, known as a FMM (Forma Migratoria Multiple). Air crews on international flights hand them out, and they are also available at Mexican airports, land border crossings and sea ports of entry. Do not lose your FMM, because you will need it to leave the country.

Entry Fee

Mexico charges a fee of approximately US\$22 to all tourists and business visitors. Airlines normally include it within the total airfare, so in the majority of cases, there will be no need for you to pay the fee separately.

Passport Validity

Your passport, regardless of country of origin, should be valid for a minimum period of six months, however long you intend to stay. Nevertheless, if you intend to stay for a short period of time the Immigration Officer might allow you entry even if your passport is valid for less than 6 months.

From the airport to the city

There is a taxi terminal at the airport. Taxis are licensed and safe to use. They accept cash only. You should give the person at the terminal the address you will stay at and they will tell you the fare price. You can also request an Uber ride; however, it is not recommended to use the UberPool feature, especially in the airport area. There are also options such as rental cars and an Airport Shuttle Service.

Health Insurance

Mexico's public health service does not have agreements with any other country, and health care systems such as US Medicare are not available here. Before travelling to Mexico, you should check with your health insurance provider to make sure you are covered. If not, it is recommended to get a travel-insurance policy.

Money

Currency

First, you should be familiar with Mexican currency. The most common bills are worth 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500 pesos. The most common coins range from 1 to 10 pesos. Before spending, you should know the exchange rate. At the time of making this guide, one USD was equivalent to 18.58 Mexican Pesos. Dollars and other currencies are not typically accepted in Guadalajara, so it is recommended that you exchange your currency before arrival.

Weather

The weather in Guadalajara is usually unpredictable. In the morning and at night it can get fairly cold. However, you should be prepared for scorching sun and high temperatures around mid-day, even during winter.

Public Transport

As far as public transportation is concerned, there are four methods to move around the city: Taxis, buses, metro and the Macrobus. There are plenty of taxis in Guadalajara, which means that pre-arranging a ride is not necessary, although is recommended. You can arrange an affiliated taxi at your hotel. You can also use Uber service, which is considered to be safer and cleaner. Getting around Guadalajara by bus is an useful option too. You can also use the Macrobus and the metro (Tren Ligero) which has two lines that cover the municipalities of Guadalajara and Zapopan. Punto Sao Paulo Mall

Andares Shopping Centre

Culture

Guadalajara Cathedral

Located at the public square known as Plaza de Armas, offers a wide variety of paintings attributed to Cristóbal de Villalpando, Miguel Cabrera, and Murillo, some of Mexico's finest artists.

The Government Palace

Located also at Plaza de Armas, offers a splendid Baroque architecture and a number of murals representing the War of Independence along with the heroes of the three Mexican wars painted by famous fresco-painter José Clemente Orozco. Open from Tuesday to Friday, 8am-7pm, free admission.

The Regional Museum of Guadalajara

Located just a few metres from the Plaza de Armas, offers exhibits dealing with local fossils and geography, a large mineral collection and a fine collection of colonial-era artwork. Open from Tuesday to Sunday, 9am-5pm, admission fee: 55 MXN.

Degollado Theatre

Home to the Philharmonic Orchestra of Jalisco as well as to cultural festivals, performances of live theatre, opera and dance. Open from Tuesday to Friday, 12:30pm-2pm and Sunday, 10am-2pm.

Hospicio Cabañas

Declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Hospicio Cabañas is one of the oldest hospitals in Latin America and it is notable for its fine murals by José Clemente Orozco. Open from Tuesday to Sunday, 10am-6pm, admission fee: 70 MXN

The Rotunda of Illustrious Men

This large circular stone monument, constructed in honour of the state's best-known historical figures, displays 17 tall columns and houses the remains of 98 important individuals. You can also appreciate a number of statues of some of these individuals. Tip: Visit the site after nightfall to see it lit up in an spectacular way.

Nature

Colomos Forest

A small forest located in a very nice area of the city. People usually go for a jog or to visit the Japanese Garden and see ducks, squirrels, and plenty other animals.

Primavera Forest

Beautiful forest located on the outskirts of the city. There are some incredible views and amazing hiking trails.

Barranca de Huentitán

Also located on the outskirts of the city, this canyon is great for hiking and an enjoying amazing views.

Trips

Mazamitla

A 2 hour drive from Guadalajara

It is a great town to spend the weekend in the countryside. Cabins are available to rent for the night. Horse riding tours are available too.

Tapalpa

A 2 hour drive from Guadalajara

It is a great town to spend the weekend in the countryside. Cabins are available to rent for the night. There are many excellent outdoor restaurants that specialise in grilled meats.

Tequila

A 1 hour drive from Guadalajara

It is a great town to spend the day out of the city. Tequila is best known as being the birthplace of the drink that bears its name, "Tequila," which is made from the blue agave plant, native to this area.

Chapala

A 1 hour drive from Guadalajara

It is a great town to spend the day out of the city. Situated next to Mexico's largest freshwater lake, Chapala is known for its beautiful historic town and its marvellous restaurants.

Security Recommendations

Guadalajara is a very beautiful and enjoyable city; however, there are certain recommendations you should follow to make sure you are safe at all times.

- → Try to keep a low profile: If you're out on the street or using public transport, make sure your valuables are not visible. Put away your phone, wallet and cash. If possible keep your bag, briefcase, or backpack closed. Don't wear eye-catching jewelry.
- → Be mindful of your valuables: If you're in a crowded place make sure to be permanently aware of where your phone and wallet are, as pickpockets are not uncommon.
- → Be extra cautious at night or in dark areas: Muggers and criminals exploit situations like these to their advantage.
- → Ask about safety: If you're planning on going somewhere, ask the locals about the area. If they tell you not to go or to take specific precautions, listen to them.
- → Be careful with both Taxi and Uber drivers: Taxi drivers are known to take advantage of foreigners who might not be familiar with the pricing by overcharging them. Also, when requesting an Uber, you should make sure the driver takes the designated route marked by the GPS.
